

STANTON – IN – PEAK PARISH COUNCIL: Minutes

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 22nd January 2020
at 7:30pm in Stanton in Peak Village Hall

1640 **To receive apologies for absence**

No apologies necessary

1641 **Variation of order of business and Clerk's request for inclusion of Time Constrained items**

No variations required. Council agreed to the inclusion of Willow Cottage planning application to meet time restrictions

1642 **Declarations of Members Interests**

No declarations were required in respect of this meeting.

1643 **Public Speaking**

a) Members of the public – The complaint about the White roof line submitted by a member of the public is now to be lodged as a Formal Complaint.

A discussion took place on our new MPs question in Parliament this afternoon to ask the Prime Minister to support quarry companies and their workers in the Peak Park. It was felt by those present that the MP should be invited to a joint meeting of Rowsley, Northwood, Birchover and ourselves to listen to the views of the communities affected by local quarrying. The PDNPA Member Kath Potter said she would raise this with Rowsley PC at their meeting next Monday and had already contacted officers at the Peak District National Park to raise awareness.

b) County Councillor Jason Aitken and PCSO A Boswell sent apologies. PDNPA Member attended for public speaking discussions only. District Councillor Matthew Buckler informed those present that he would be attending a meeting with Tim Braund, Environmental Health and the Environment Agency to clarify where their responsibilities lie with HJ Enthoven. Council asked that Light, Sound, Acrid Smell and HGVs be raised – the latter as it appears that no consideration is given in planning applications due to the EA determining the limits on HGV movements rather than Planners or Highways.

He was asked to raise the planning issues with the officer approved HJ Enthoven White roofed buildings at the next DDDC Planning Committee as there is no place on the Committee agenda for members of the public to speak on already approved applications. He was also asked to chase Planners lack of response to Ecobat re change of use from Residential permission and external lighting permission as well as EH light spillage issues.

1644 **To confirm the Non-exempt minutes of the previous meeting**

RESOLVED to confirm as a correct record the minutes of the meeting held on 27th November 2019. The minutes were signed by the Chair.

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NP/DDD/1119/1216 – Willow Cottage, 1 Main Rd – extension of parking area at front Council

Council supports this extension of an existing small car off road space to safely keep a larger vehicle off the highway but requests that a kerb to retain the chippings to prevent from spilling out onto the sloping carriageway be included in the approved design.

iii) Planning updates/issues:

Tonnage – Site now active and tonnage movement notifications being received. – quarries to be moved to Reports section for future meetings.

Items for clarification with PDNPA: Invalid Appeals – general query as to what happens next to be asked.

Items for clarification with DDDC:

Ecobat – on all night external lighting and change of use from residential – no direct update

Enthoven – non-permission external lighting query – no direct update – still with DDDCouncillor

1647 Footpaths and Highways

Pilhough Crossroads 35751906 plus 30 mph sign move and missing village sign on Stanton Hill outstanding – still no satisfactory conclusion – householder forced to pay to divert the altered flow from flooding private land and sign work is to be included with 30mph legal changes. Road stream from fields is now flowing again near junction with icing fears again. Lees Road 2nd collapse endangering the high pressure water main. The request to change the gritting route has been made again due to lost ambulances and gritter having to reverse.

Request for a mirror on the junction of Stanton in Peak Lees Road and Birchover – response awaited from DCC Highways.

Noted that any lost public footpaths need establishing before 2026 or will be lost for good.

1648 Reports

i. The Green / Parish assets

The Green – Play inspection report noted cleaning of play surface advised but questions about the area are now uncertain without a lease. Fisher German have yet to come back and the Clerk will query progress.

ii. Church and VH signs – Stanton Estate has fitted the replacement post for the churchyard sign and the sign will be installed in early February.

Trading Standards have successfully prosecuted another “lost” HGV
