Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 23rd November 2016 At 7:30pm in Stanton in Peak Village Hall

- PRESENT:Cllr S Fogg, Cllr R Griffith, Cllr P Morris, I Mortimore and Cllr N WarrIn attendance: Matthew Lovell (Clerk) and 5 members of the public
- 1355 **Co-Option of members for 3 vacancies**

Ros Griffith was co-opted, signed the declaration of acceptance and was welcomed by councillors to the meeting. Vacancies for 2 councillors remain open.

- 1356 **To receive apologies for absence** No apologies were necessary.
- 1357 Variation of order of business and Clerk's request for inclusion of Time Constrained items No variations or inclusions required.

1358 **Declarations of Members Interests** None required for this meeting.

1359 Public Speaking

The District and County Councillor Jo Wild noted that her discussions with Highways had found a reduced department dealing with the matter but the matter being muddled by the inclusion of 4 lane ends problems. She noted she had funds available and will be looking to assist the Village Hall as County Councillor leaving District monies available to a Council project.

PDNPA member Kath Potter raised the traffic issues from the gridlock with Chatsworth and Bakewell Christmas markets the previous weekend and fears of the 45 days of heavy traffic next year into Chatsworth for the RHS show. Baslow, Rowsley and Beeley are asking the Police Commissioner to visit to discuss the impact of local traffic issues.

PCSO Anthony Boswell introduced himself as the replacement for Hayley Grundy who has moved to cover Chesterfield and noted the main issues are van and shed break-ins and asked parishioners to report suspicious vehicles and persons to 101.

iii) Planning updates/issues:

NP/DDD/0712/0760 – New Pilhough Quarry – revised extraction – Drop In Meeting As agreed at the Minerals Liaison, Blockstone will attend for a one to one discussion with interested parties and Council will make space available for other parties – SADE, Stanton Less vs, PDNPA Minerals, Friends of the Peak and Council to talk to those interested. The clerk chased a date to meet tomorrow's Snail deadline without success but is to pre-notify parishioners of the event in Snail. (Post meeting date agreed 8th December 5pm-6:30pm for Blockstone – hall hire 4pm to 7:30pm)

Appeals: APP/M9496/C/16/3156666 - Appeal against an enforcement notice of enforcement Swallow Cottage - Creation a raised parking/turning area, change of use of agricultural land to domestic New Garage not built in accordance with approved plans - APPLICATION NP/DDD/0415/0271 REFUSED APPEAL SUBMITTED AND ALSO REFUSED

The Parish Council fully supports the conditions placed by the Peak Park Planners and wishes to see them complied with in full to ensure this prominent National Park hillside is returned to as near its former contours as can be practically achieved.

1363 Footpaths and Highways

Highways: clarification that hedges are the responsibility of landowners who Highways will contact if overgrowing but verges are a Highway responsibility. It was noted that Darley Bridge will be closed for ten days next year for works on a gas main and Council concurred that the least disruption would be during works closure periods eg over Easter to minimise HGV traffic through Winster. Two stuck caravan incidents due to underpowered cars trying to haul uphill through Stanton Lees to Barn Farm were reported both blocking traffic for an hour while locals assisted their removal.

Reports and Decisions

1364 Reports

i. The Green / Parish assets

The Green - Estate section is held under a yearly licence.

The website is in a fledgling state and available to view online and the clerk received a password today and will populate with Transparency data by the next meeting. <u>parishclerk@stantoninpeakparish.org.uk</u> is now the official clerk address. The District Councillor is to be asked to fund a noticeboard replacement for Stanton Lees.

- ii. Enthoven liaison the signage issues were raised noting the damage being done to Enthoven reputation and all parties are chasing Highways but the scope has been widened to address 4 Lane ends further delaying matters. Noise issues have suffered a reversal from last Thursday with levels increasing and non-muffled roadsweepers being used again which will be raised at the residents meeting on 30th November.
- iii. Digital Derbyshire it is understood that the next round of provider consultations is not due until the New Year but the fund was underspent and BT take up should also make further funds available however 2020 is being cited for any resultant works.
- iv. Stanton Moor Minerals Liaison a drop in meeting was agreed to by Blockstone.
- v. Stanton Moor meeting a report was circulated and the clerk read the notice received from

Stanton Estates to explain the measures being taken on 1st and 2nd December to remove scrub from the Southeast area of the Moor.

vi. HGV issues and signs. all parties are chasing DCC for the signs.

The response from the Cabinet member for transport was not acceptable and our County Councillor is chasing Highways. No reply yet received from the Police Superintendent and the clerk will chase.

vii. Local Health Consultations

Council considers the distress caused by ill thought out proposals to the residents of the rural communities and the fundamental errors and flaws now exposed an excellent reason to dismiss this consultation and seek to properly integrate the invaluable care wards into all future plans with no further talk of closure.
