Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 12th September 2023

1905 **Apologies for absence**

Apologies were accepted from Councillors A Mellor

1906 **Variation of order of business and Clerk's request for inclusion of Time Constrained items**

1907 **Declarations of Members Interests**

No declarations were required in respect of this meeting.

1908 **Public Speaking**

a) Members of the public

A member of the public raised a complaint emailed in on 14th July but the clerk had to apologise and note that nothing had been received – email address was taken to clarify. A member of SADE noted that the New Pilhough 2 year extra extension needs raising at this week's PDNPA Minerals liaison as the Stanton Moor Principles only allow where there is material benefit and none has been proved. The withdrawn 10 year extension needs bringing to the attention of the new officers to ensure they are fully aware of the supply and demand basis the quarry declared it is working on. SAFER representatives noted the expiry of planning on the 3 year limit had run out. They noted outstanding EA lead-in-air reports, DDDC enforcement action for clause 3 and whether permission 18/00919/FUL has been lawfully implemented and that Council needs to chase for DDDC Chris Whitmore reply to outstanding items if these are not supplied at the next liaison meeting. Production Quantities are still a minefield by annual report admissions are proving the increase.

b) DCCllr Sue Hobson DDDCllr Laura Mellstrom and PCSO A Boswell sent apologies.

PDNPA Parish Member Kath Potter attended for public speaking only and noted: the new town and country planning act with amendments to change of use, agricultural diversification and non-domestic applications appears to give no protection to the National Parks. The loss of 19 planning officers and a qualified Minerals Officer has created a need for major changes under new Chief executive

iii) Planning updates/issues:

Tonnage sheets have been received for loads out meeting movement conditions. Items for clarification with PDNPA: noted that a councillor will represent us at the 6th October planning committee if the Quarry extension application is tabled.

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Items for clarification with DDDC: Ecobat – Frost Lighting glare not yet commented on. The on all night lighting is not mentioned in the site survey even though this building is part of the Ecobat works. Residents desire for timer lighting needs raising.

1912 Footpaths and Highways

The Stand – no news. Highways – 30 mph boundary move consultation has closed.

Lees road collapse – signage has improved and the barriers rearranged. The current closure expires in December '23 and a long term solution is awaited.

The Give Way sign at the bottom of the hill has been knocked over.

The Closed footpath from Coach Lane to the cottages on Congreave Lane. The meeting was suspended to hear comment from the field owners who were advised that this is not listed as a public footpath by PROW in January. Council has received two complaints from users asking us why this path which is marked on all OS maps from the first edition has been closed. Council agreed to email Northern Footpaths Association and see what evidence they have and if they or us should be asking for an amendment to the definitive map if such exists as this is a safe track to avoid the steep sided narrow lane from the crossroads and historically significant.

1913 Reports and Decisions

i. The Green / Parish assets

Lower gate - end of wall by gate. Top gate post needs refixing in position.

Question as to whether the wildflower area works as a child was stung by nettles was raised if the wrong plants are growing on a play area. 2 signs for Vets in Stanton Lees were costed up and agreed for order. Tommy will be placed in the churchyard by 14th October to support the poppy appeal and remembrance. The defib was taken out by a paramedic and used and new pads have been ordered.

We have no spare grit for winter and the clerk will organise purchase.

ii. Stanton Moor liaison meeting

This is being restarted by PDNPA on 9th November. The incident with pallets being brought across the moor and set fire to in the centre of the stone circle was abhorred for its criminal damage to the ancient monument.

iii. Ecobat Resources Liaison meeting – Lighting / noise

This was discussed at length in public speaking and residents complaints from both Warren Carr and Stanton Lees will continue to be pursued.

It was noted that our loan sound meter gives very comparable readings to the Ecobat one allowing Warren Carr to give its own data to assist with evidence in future.
